LOCATION AND FACILITIES

Wheaton College is a prestigious co-ed Liberal Arts college located in Norton, Massachusetts. The campus is situated 35 miles south of Boston and 15 miles north of Providence.

The facilities will include two international full size gorgeous soccer fields (Mirrione Stadium and Keefe Field), two small sided game fields and a swimming pool.

Wheaton's soccer fields were used as the training facility for the Nigerian Men's National Team during the 1994 World Cup.

DIRECTIONS

From Boston and Northern New England:

Take the Southeast Expressway (Rt. 93 South) to 93/128, and follow to I-95 South. Take I-95 South to Exit 6A (Rt. 495 South).

*Follow 495 South to Exit 10. Take a right at the end of the ramp and proceed on Rt. 123 West. Take a left on Pine Street and then the second right in to campus.

From Providence and Southern New England:

Take I-95 North to Exit 6A (Rt. 495 South). Follow from * above.
